

# **Role summary**

- 2. Collaborate with staff, partners and stakeholders to draft funding applications
- 3. Prepare and design budgets and adhere to procurement processes for funding applications and project proposals
- 4. Draft contracts and agreements (with the support of the Commercial & Finance Manager) to facilitate delivery of projects
- 5. Supervise and administer external contracts and agreements as required
- 6. Design appropriate record keeping systems and maintain records in an efficient and timely manner
- 7. Prepare reports and financial acquittals

- 6. **High level organisation skills:** Exceptional attention to detail, time management skills and ability to meet deadlines. Ability to independently identify solutions and self-educate.
