Planting trees, or revegetation, is at the heart of land restoration.

In our 20+ year history, South West NRM's revegetation projects have taken on a myriad of forms from small-scale community tree planting events with families and school students to large-scale commercial revegetation and carbon farming projects involving as many as 100,000 seedlings.

Since the year 2000, tree cover in Western Australia has been reduced by 40%, according to Global Forest Watch. Between 2001 and 2023 we lost 2.29 million hectares of tree cover.
